### “Father Wanted”

A 10' x 12' adobe room with a dirt floor in one of the more dangerous neighborhoods on the northern side of Chiclayo can hardly be called a home, but some would say the anywhere can be a “home” as long as there is love and care, but for these three children there was none of the above, their mother would leave them alone in the room at night while she sold her body on a nearby street corner for a few dollars an hour. During the day her chemically induced sleep was deep enough to ignore the noise in the room as the oldest, 5 year old Cynthia would do her best to care for her 3 year old brother Segundo and 1 year old sister Nayeli. That was their reality 3 ½ years



ago when the landlord reported the situation to the police and the children were taken into custody and subsequently declared wards of the state. At the time of their removal they were placed in a children’s home that although an improvement to their original situation did little to give them a proper upbringing. They were considered unmanageable by the staff there which lead to the request that they be removed from that facility, which in turn resulted in the three being sent to separate facilities and distanced from each other. In April of this year the family court judge in charge of their care asked that they be transferred to Morning Star. Upon evaluating the case we decided that these siblings needed to be together and retrained to understand God’s love

and that in our firm and caring environment they would encounter a different future. The inevitable adjustment period was shorter than expected, their parched little hearts rapidly soaked up the love and attention they were given and responded immediately to the guidance away from their attention seeking negative behavior towards the safety and security of unconditional love and firm discipline. In short they blossomed admirably! Due to the difficult life they

have had to endure, they are mature beyond their years but deeply affectionate and eager to please and very bright.



They have been on the docket for adoption for over a year, but Peruvian law discourages splitting up siblings and finding families willing to adopt older sibling groups is virtually impossible.....for man that is.....but not for God. Their age and grouping place them in a special adoption category in Peru which allows them to be selected by the adopting family and expedites their adoption process.
